#### A Christmas message from Rev Simon

As we have explored the season of Advent over these past few weeks, we have focused on the idea of anticipation. It is good and right to dwell on the anticipation that foreshadowed Christ's first coming, and that continues to shape our lives, in different ways, as we await his second coming.

In life, it is important to attend to all its facets and seasons, even when they do not reflect how we currently feel or what we are presently experiencing. During Lent, for example, we give voice to lament and sorrow, even if we are not consciously feeling them at the time. In doing so, we prepare ourselves for those moments when such grief does arise. We embody and articulate these emotions ahead of time, allowing them to shape us before they are fully felt.

The same is true of Advent, with its focus on anticipation. Advent proclaims that things are not as they should be. This may be personal: we know our bodies should not be failing as they are, that we should not be living with such pain, that our family circumstances should be different. It may also be global: the world should not be in the state it is in; the things we see in the news should not be happening; children should not be starving.

All of this draws us toward anticipation — the recognition that there is only one who can truly set things right. He has come once and, in doing so, has changed the entire landscape of reality. As the apostle Paul writes, the whole of creation is groaning as in the pains of childbirth, waiting for this new reality to be fully revealed. Advent gives us language for this longing, this honest acknowledgment of our brokenness.

As we move into Christmas, we encounter the fulfilment of this promise in Christ Jesus. The hope and anticipation of Advent are not vague wishes or empty optimism; they are sure and well-founded. Christ has come once, and we celebrate and rejoice in his coming and in all that he accomplished. In that first coming, he also promised that he would come\_again. And just as he came once and fulfilled all he set out to do, so we can trust that his promises are faithful and true, and that he will indeed come again to make all things right.

#### Work Day - Saturday 20 December: 2pm


We will be concentrating on tidying up outside the church including around the sand bags by the wall. There will also be inside jobs for those who prefer to work inside.


