

Food Bank Cupboard

Thank you to everyone who has continued to put items into the cupboard during January.

Repair Cafe

The next Silsden Repair Cafe is on Saturday 21 February at Silsden Methodist Church - between 9.30am and noon.

Climate Action Silsden hold a refill shop at the Repair Café. They stock Miniml (now based in Silsden!) household and personal care products, (all products are Vegan, Cruelty Free and Paraben-Free and contain no synthetic dyes or perfumes).

The liquids available are: washing up liquid, laundry detergent, fabric conditioner, multi-surface cleaner, toilet cleaner, floor cleaner, hand soap, bubble bath / shower gel, shampoo and hair conditioner. Please take your empty containers and the refill shop will fill them for you. They are a profit-free organisation and so sell at cost price, just with a small round-up to cover costs of any spills.

Saturday Morning Prayers - Saturday 28 February

World Day of Prayer Friday 6 March 2026

Our sisters in Nigeria invite us to join them for the [World Day of Prayer](#) on Friday 6 March 2026 at 2.00pm at Steeton Methodist church. The service they have prepared reflects on the theme, "*I will give you rest*".

The World Day of Prayer is an international, women-led, ecumenical movement that shares the hopes, concerns, and prayers of women from around the globe. Each year, women from a different country craft a service, sharing their unique spiritual journey and culture. For 2026, the women of Nigeria have created a service that speaks to our need for peace and solace. They are drawing on their Christian faith and experiences in a world filled with struggles and anxieties.

The preparation for this day is extensive. The writing country and theme are chosen years in advance. The service then travels to the international committee in New York for translation and dissemination to national committees in over 120 participating countries. From there it is adapted and shared locally, culminating in gatherings at hundreds of churches every March.

This day is a powerful demonstration of global solidarity. It begins in Samoa and moves across the world in a continuous wave of prayer. It finishes 38 hours later in American Samoa. This is truly a worldwide day of prayer! Beginning and ending in the Pacific islands.

Lent Book 2026 – ‘The Familiar Stranger’ by Tyler Staton

If you are looking for a book to read over Lent together with other members of our church family then we invite you to join in reading our chosen book for Lent 2026 – *The Familiar Stranger* by Tyler Staton.

In *The Familiar Stranger*, Tyler Staton reintroduces this oft-neglected Person of the Trinity, tracing the story of the Holy Spirit as it unfolds throughout the Bible, and inviting believers to close the gap between what Scripture reveals about the Holy Spirit and their lived experience.

The idea is that we read it over Lent, perhaps discussing it with the people we know at church as we go. We will all then assemble in the Hall on the morning of Saturday 28 March to share our thoughts on, and our responses to, the book.

The book can be purchased on line through different outlets and is available in different forms – audio book, Kindle version, hard cover and paperback.

We recognize that books are becoming more and more expensive so if it is difficult for you to find the money needed to buy the book please have a word with Rev Simon.
